Possible French Air Base in the Ivory Coast:

rrance is reportedly considering establishment of an air base in the Ivory Coast. A study on the feasibility of stationing Jaguar jet aircraft at Bouake, approximately 300 kilometers north of Abidjan, has been completed by an air force team and coordinated with the Ivorians. It is now under review, and it is expected that the decision will be announced before President Giscard's visit to the former French colony in November. At the fourth Franco-African summit held in Dakar, Senegal, last April, Giscard verbally committed French support to countries of Africa to combat any foreign attack or interference. The proposed establishment of an airbase could be part of an effort to honor that commitment. If the base is established, it is probable it will be the logistic arm of the new West African nonagression/defense pact.
